

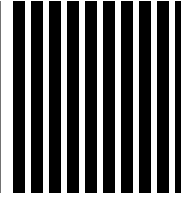

Other Sources of Financial Aid

Work-Study Program

The work-study program at Lawrence Tech, which is supported by both federal and state funds, provides jobs for undergraduate and graduate students with financial need, allowing them to earn money to help pay educational expenses. The program encourages community service and work related to a student's studies. A student's total work-study award depends on his or her level of need. Working students receive bi-weekly paychecks. The amount earned cannot exceed the total work-study award. Because the need for jobs may exceed the number of jobs available, a work-study award does not necessarily guarantee the recipient a job. Students who receive a work-study award should contact the Office of Career Services for a listing of available positions.

Michigan Education Trust (MET)

MET benefits can be used to pay tuition for a designated number of credit hours as well as mandatory fees, such as registration and student activities fees. Students must notify the MET that they will be attending Lawrence Tech by calling 800.638.4543. For students who are receiving financial aid, the amount of MET eligibility will be counted as a resource (per current federal regulations) and may reduce their eligibility for other financial aid programs. Adjustments may be made to the MET payment amount depending upon information received by the state regarding the student's eligibility.

Michigan Merit Award

High school seniors receive notification of eligibility for the Michigan Merit Award from the Michigan Department of Treasury. An award of \$2,500, divided over two years, is based on successful completion of the Michigan Educational Assessment Program (MEAP). Lawrence Tech receives a roster of eligible students from the state once a month. If a student designates Lawrence Tech as her or his school of choice, the University will apply \$1,250 toward the fall semester's bill in each of the student's first two years of attendance. Investing in your future at Lawrence Technological University can give you the edge you need to be successful in today's extremely competitive market. Lawrence Tech's Office of Financial Aid offers a broad array of financial aid programs, including scholarships, grants, loans, and work study, to assist you in meeting your educational goals. About two-thirds of the University's students receive some form of financial assistance from various private, state, and federal programs.

The Office of Financial Aid plays a key role in your financial planning. Knowledgeable and experienced counselors can help you explore the many alternatives available to help finance your education. They will help you put together a financial package that fits your needs.

Types of Aid

There are two types of financial aid: the first type is based on scholastic achievement, the second type on demonstrated financial need. Most students receive assistance in some combination of scholarships, grants, loans, and work-study wages. Regardless of what form your package may take, consider it for what it is—an investment in your future success.

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Lawrence Tech uses the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to determine your eligibility for need-based financial aid. The FAFSA serves as the official application for federal and state financial aid programs.

The FAFSA form is available online at www.fafsa.ed.gov.

Before you apply, remember:

- You must be a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen with a valid Social Security number.
- You must be a high school graduate or a senior in high school. High school seniors cannot apply until after January 1.
- Read the instructions carefully. Missing or incorrect information can cause your application to be delayed. Don't forget to include the federal school code for Lawrence Tech (**002279**).
- You must complete the FAFSA annually (after January 1).
